The "Atelier de Création" works in Harmony with the Rest of the Moulin Rouge Creative Studios to ensure that the Artists' Costumes are of a Unique Quality and Unparalleled Comfort.

- The Feathermaker

"Atelier Valentin" handcrafts Beautiful Creations, embellishing the Artists' Costumes so that the Magic can happen from the Moment the Stage Lights come up. Embroidery lends Elegance, Rrefinement and Finesse to the Costumes... a True Sense of Craftsmanship!

- The Bootmaker

Established in 1945 on Rue Pierre Fontaine in Paris, "Maison Clairvoy" has specialised in the Performing Arts since 1955. This Artistic Studio creates Made-To-Measure Shoes to dress the Feet of a Wide Range of Artists – from Circus Performers to Actors, as well as Theatre Artists and even Parisian Cabaret Performers. The Master Bootmakers here are Hard at Work, Day in, Day out, crafting the Dancers' Shoes by Hand, and ensuring that they are Durable, Comfortable and of an Exceptional Quality.
